INDIAN RETAIL TRADERS AND ALGO TRADING

It is unquestionably obvious that over the years, technology has prepared to reduce human intervention. We can see this impact over many industries, one of them being the stock market. The shift from open outcry to a completely digitalized trading platform is remarkable. But the journey doesn't stop there. Today's world is moving towards a scenario where machines based on pre-set programs can buy and sell stocks.

With the inception of coronavirus, the Indian stock market has seen a euphoric rise in terms of trading volume. Lack of job opportunities and being confined to their homes have led to more retail traders entering the market. On July 8, 2021, Central Depository Services (India) Limited (CDSL) achieved the feat of having 4 crores active Demat accounts, of which 1 crore accounts were added in a matter of five months. This data interprets the intensity of the increase in the interest towards investing and trading.

Investing and trading are often used interchangeably. But both are different concepts. Investing is a long-term process of passive income generation and capital appreciation, which requires a lot of patience and fundamental analysis. While on the contrary, trading is done relying on technical analysis and charts to make a regular income from price fluctuations. This makes trading riskier than investing. Risks like price fluctuation risk, marketability risk and gap risk are a part and parcel of trading. Many people lose money in the stock market primarily because of the absence of a proper trading strategy and setup. Novice traders fall into the trap of taking unsolicited advice from the so-called "market gurus". Hence, algorithmic trading programs could act as a catalyst in improving the profitability of retail traders by assisting them in making an informed decision.

Algorithmic trading works through previously coded programs and applications wherein the computer will carry out trading functions on behalf of the traders. If a trader sets in all the criteria for a trade to occur, a computer program will scan graphs and buy or sell stocks automatically once the conditions are satisfied. One of the major advantages of Algo trading is that it reduces the chances of human errors and executes a trade at a speed that is next to impossible for a human trader. Even though algorithmic trading might seem like a relativity new concept for the Indian stock market, many will be surprised to know that around 40% of trades in NSE (National Stock Exchange) gets executed using algorithmic trading setups. India introduced Algo trading during the year 2008. The technology now required to run algorithmic trades is highly sophisticated and is primarily dealt with by a few big trading houses. However, that does not restrict retail investors from venturing into the world of Algo trading. Brokers like Zerodha kite API and 5paisa have slowly extended Algo trading services to retail investors who can log in to the developer account and create their strategies.

Ultimately, technology can be a boon or a bane. It depends on how we use it. Algorithmic trading is also a technology that can reward the traders immensely if used the right way with adequate back-testing. the world is transitioning into a more digitalized version of itself. Hence the days are not far off when we will witness new generation retail traders developing their Algo trading setup.






